

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Executive Summary

Introduction

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) traces its origins to 1947, the year of India's independence. Gandhigram, a village purposely named after the father of the Nation, was established by a team of disciples of Babuji, led by Dr.T.S.Soundram and Dr.G.Ramachandran with a view to providing higher education to the rural youth and to train them as social engineers who would serve the rural masses and contribute to the reconstruction of rural India.

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) was established in the year 1956, under the auspices of the National Council for Rural Higher Education (Ministry of Human Resource Development / Ministry of Education, Government of India) as one of the 11 Rural Institutes established in various parts of the country. Right from its inception, GRI has founded its educational principles on the revolutionary concept of *Nai Talim*, a new system different from the mainstream of western higher education in India, with extension as the central focus, linking teaching and research.

While all the other 10 rural institutes got affiliated to their neighbouring universities, GRI established its name by steadfastly pursuing its mission of taking higher education to the rural masses. This Institute has its genesis in the extension programmes conducted in the rural environs which made extension as the pivotal component of education.

GRI, since its inception, has been rendering yeomen service by empowering the rural populace through educational and extension services. The educational model blended with Gandhian ideologies was recognized as a pioneering practice to educate and train social architects for integrated rural development. In recognition of its noble and relentless services rendered in the realm of the triangulated dimension of higher education, namely, teaching, research, and extension, GRI was conferred with the status of a Deemed to be University in August 1976 by the University Grants Commission. The Institute is governed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, and is fully funded by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

The curricular model developed at GRI integrating teaching, research and extension earned the Institute the status of a Deemed to be University in 1976, from UGC. GRI was one among the two universities in Tamil Nadu accredited with the Five Star Status by NAAC in 2002 (1st Cycle). Subsequently, it was accredited with 'A' Grade in the 2nd and 3rd cycles in 2010 and 2016 respectively. In the NIRF ranking ladder, the institute was placed in the rank band 101-150 among universities of the country in NIRF 2021, GRI has been ranked 91st in 2020, 75th rank in 2019, 79th rank in 2018 and 91st rank in 2017among universities.

The functional framework of GRI is deep-rooted in Gandhian ideologies of education and extension and its core objectives are: to provide instruction and training in such branches of learning as will promote a classless and casteless society; to provide for research and advancement and dissemination of framework; and to function as a centre for extension work leading to integrated rural development.

GRI has eight Schools, sixteen Departments, Sixteen Centres, Library Science and DDU-Kaushal Kendra. Under this academic setup, 83 academic programmes from Diploma to M.Phil level, besides the doctoral programmes. As per statutory requirements, select programmes offered by GRI are approved by AICTE and NCTE.

The quality of teaching and learning at GRI is assured by 122 well-qualified, experienced and committed faculty members. The vigour of research on campus is promoted by 486 research scholars and 4 post-doctoral fellows. As many as 106 permanent non-teaching and technical staff offer support to teaching, research and extension activities. 116 Adhoc teachers are also appointed to meet the needs of the ever increasing student strength.

Academic Programmes

The curricular design of the programmes offered at GRI pivot on core and allied skill development of the graduating students with due provisions to imbibe social and cultural values and help the students emerge as social architects. The institute is determined to develop socially responsible and professionally competent graduates to meet the demands for human resources in educational, industrial, research and development and social service sectors. The institute offers mandatory value-based courses on *"Gandhi's Life, Thought and Work"* and *"Gandhi in Everyday Life"* in order to implant Gandhian values in the younger generation.

During 2020-2021, GRI offered 20 M.Phil. programmes (one year), One PG (3 years), 20 PG (2 years), 6 PG Diploma (one year), 2 Five-year Integrated, 5 UG (4 years), 11 UG (3 years), 8 B.Voc.programmes (3 years), 4 Diploma (2 years), One Diploma Programme (one year), 2 D.Voc. Programmes (1 year), and One Certificate Course apart from B.Ed. and M.Ed. Programmes. The Institute follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) regulations of the UGC. Out of the 1088 students who appeared for the End Semester Examinations, 1012 students passed, constituting a pass percentage of 93. The number of Ph.D. degrees awarded during the year was 102. The institute has been following the semester examination pattern since 1976. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is in practice since 1996.

Admission

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Gandhigram Rural Institute adopted online admission system and was able to reach graduating aspirants from across the country and beyond, during 2020-2021. The number of applications received through online registration was 25334 and 22552 eligible applications against which 1721 students were admitted to various academic programmes offered during the year. As in the previous years, female students have outnumbered male students. Though the majority of enrolled students are from Tamil Nadu, GRI has also attracted students from other states of India, namely the Bihar, Kerala, Manipur, Rajasthan, West Bengal and Telengana. The enrolment for M.Phil.and Ph.D. programmes was 07 and 62 respectively. GRI follows the reservation policy of the Government of India as well as the norms laid by UGC. Admissions are strictly based on merit.

Funded Research Projects

Funded projects are a functional entity of the research culture and climate of a higher educational institution. The faculty members of GRI submitted 34 project proposals to funding agencies, namely, UGC, DST, CSIR, ISRO, BRNS, IRMA, ICSSR, RGNIYD, DRDO, DBT, ICMR, PCRA, KSCSTE, NISE, AICTE, MNRE, NBHM and State Planning Commission, Tamil Nadu with a total budget outlay of Rs. 14.40 crores. A sum of Rs. 98.6 lakhs have been received during the period under report.

At the department level, six departments have received funds under UGC-SAP and four departments under DST-FIST (Level I & II).

Conferences / Workshops / Seminars Organized

Being a vibrant educational and research hub, GRI regularly organizes a number of programmes to create platforms for knowledge sharing and dissemination on the latest trends and technologies. During the year under report, 96 International / National / State / University / College level Programmes were organized viz., 1 International Conference, 7 International Webinars, 2 International Symposiums, 1 International Faculty Development Programme, 22 National Level Webinars / Seminars, 2 National Level Workshops, 2 National Level Symposium, 11 National Level Training / FDP / Orientation programmes, 31 National Level Special lectures / brainstorming / other programmes, 1 State level Workshop, 5 State level Webinar / Seminar, 3 State level Special lectures / brainstorming / other programmes, 2 University level Webinar / Seminars and 3 College level Special lectures / brainstorming / other programmes. Nearly 15,607 participants, covering faculty members, scientists, research scholars, and students have benefitted through these programmes.

Participation in Conferences / Seminars/ Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes

The faculty members are encouraged to augment their domain knowledge, share and upgrade their expertise by participating in academic and research platforms. They have participated in 229 such programs and have presented 27 research articles. Towards knowledge dissemination, faculty members delivered 244 keynote address and invited lectures.

The Institute periodically arranges faculty development programmes and workshops aimed at quality enrichment. 07 Faculty members have attended Refresher Courses, 09 faculty members attended Orientation Programmes, 07 faculty members attended Short Term Courses and 22 faculty members attended Faculty Development Programme conducted by Human Resource Development Centres of various universities.

Research Publications

Research is an important dimension of higher educational institutions. In this regard, GRI is putting in its best efforts to enhance its visibility through quality research publications. The faculty members have brought out 269 publications in reputed and refereed journals, including those listed by the UGC during 2020-2021.

The bibliometric details of the publications up to 2022 are: 2737 Scopus (h-index: 84) and 2052 by Web of Sciences (h-index: 79). Additionally, 54 Conference Proceedings, 13 books, 3 edited books, 41 chapters in books, and 2 monographs have been authored by the faculty members. GRI promotes research publication culture among the researchers through its two journals, namely, *Journal of Extension and Research* (ISSN: 0972-351X) and *Gandhigram Literary Review* (ISSN: 2278-8190).

Visits Abroad & International Associations

The quality of research in GRI has been opening up newer avenues for collaborations/associations with Universities/Colleges overseas.

Research Fellowships

A total of 80 research scholars received funds under UGC-RGNF, UGC-MANF, UGC-EMERITUS, UGC-DSRPDFHS, UGC-SGC, UGC-PDFSS, UGC-PDFWM, UGC-JRF, UGC-SRF, CSIR-SRF, UGC-BSR, UGC-SVSGC, DST-PDF, DST-Inspire, ICSSR-PDF, ICMR and other schemes.

MoUs and Collaborations

In 2020-21, GRI has signed 5 MoUs with reputed educational institutions/ organizations in addition to 59 on-going collaborations.

GRI has signed an agreement with National Database Management Limited (NDML) for uploading the students' credentials in the National Academic Depository (NAD). During the year 2020-21, 1341 students have registered on NAD for which a link is provided in the Institute's website. As on date, 6042 students of GRI have registered in NAD.

Extension Programmes

The extension and outreach activities aimed at integrated rural development are the prime pillars of GRI. For this purpose, Village Placement Programmes (VPP) and Extension Activities are amalgamated suitably into the curriculum of all the programmes offered at GRI. The VPP greatly enables the GRI staff and students to get hands-on experience on the problems and challenges of rural life.

In view of Covid-19 situation students were not placed in the villages as part of Village Placement Programme (VPP) during 2020-21 academic year. However, designed a process and obtained data from the students on their awareness of rural issues. It is considered as methods for "Experiential Learning"

which is the prime goal of Village Placement Programme (VPP). The UG and PG students who were studying third semester during the academic year 2020-21 have participated in the survey. The survey was conducted on-line during December 2020. In this section of the Report, data on the level of awareness of the students on rural issues is presented. The survey was conducted as on-line and 817 students studying in third semester during July-December 2020 have participated.

As a national recognition, the Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Panchayati Raj and Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation of the Govt. of India have recognized GRI (DU) as a National Level Monitor (NLM).

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

During 2020-2021, nine villages from three Taluks, covered under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) programme of the Government of India. Activities aimed at the upliftment of villages were carried out during these programmes. The students and the staff were engaged in various rural development oriented activities during VPP. As part of the extension activities, students were involved in various activities, namely, *Shramadhan*, afforestation, anti-plastic campaign, baseline surveys, and awareness campaigns on health, sanitation, hygiene and other social issues.

Sports, Games & Yoga

To encourage and foster sports and games among the students of GRI, the Centre for Physical Education and Yoga trains the students for intra and intercollegiate sports tournaments. A course on *Sports and Games* is being offered as a foundation course for all UG students. Yoga Education is a non-credit mandatory course for the first year students. The sports teams of GRI won a number of sports/games tournaments at the state and the regional level.

Awards Won by GRI

GRI received Certificate for Perennial Assistance Award of Rs.1,75,000/- for effective delivery of UBA mandate under national level competition among all participating Institutions of UBA on 15th August 2020 by UBA National Coordinating Institute, IIT Delhi.

Awards Won by Faculty

Ten faculty members have received awards for their substantial contribution in the arena of Higher Education in terms of academics, research and extension.

Governance

The Honourable Union Minster of HRD, Gol, is the Chairman of the GRI Society. In 2020-21, a meeting of the Board of Management, the Planning and Monitoring Board, the Academic Council, the Finance Committee and the GRI Society meeting were held.

Finance

During the FY 2020-2021, GRI received Rs.64,81,00,000/- under maintenance grant and which the expenditure was Rs.72,34,91,554/-.

Summing Up

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GRI is constantly making its mark in every sphere of teaching, research and extension. Its credentials, recognitions, accomplishments and action-packed strategic plans would undoubtedly facilitate the institution to attain heights of excellence and reach new horizons of quality assurance and sustenance in higher education.

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Extension through Community Outreach

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) is being fully funded by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The UGC, New Delhi has developed academic programs in rural development, rural economics and extension education, rural oriented sciences, co-operation, development administration, rural sociology, English, Tamil and Indian languages. The institute is also offering Engineering, Technology related academic and vocational educational programs.

Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) is quite active on both campus and off campus (rural areas) in the vicinity, for mutually benefitting and enriching one another. Besides, its contribution in teaching, from Pre-primary, certificate, diploma, degree and all the way to Post-doctorate levels. The Institute applies the learning from both scientific and social research to solve contemporary rural problems. The curriculum is a combination of theoretical, practical and extension approaches. The Institute has become home to many pioneering models of rural development programmes. The students and scholars who emerge from its portals tend to meet the personnel needs of rural development programmes under various governmental and non-governmental organizations.

The three dimensional approach of higher education namely teaching, research and extension has become a highly celebrated model, earning global and nationwide appreciation. Started in a small way the Institute has evolved into a reasonably large and expansive educational complex comprising of 8 schools, 16 departments and 12 Centres offering various academic and also vocational programs, ranging from certificate courses, to Graduate programmes to Doctoral and post-Doctoral Programmes.

The curricular model developed at GRI organically integrating teaching, research and extension components has earned the Institute, the status of Deemed to be University in 1976 by UGC, the five-star status by NAAC in 2002, 'A' Grade during the re-accreditation in 2010 by NAAC and 'A' Grade in its third cycle of reaccreditation in the year 2016.

Thus the Institute has been taking efforts to design its academic programs in tune with the demands of the society and industry by providing a learner-centric, transparent teaching and evaluation methods. Through the action-oriented research and scientific research, the Institute contributes substantially to the research domains and concentrates on solving the rural issues at micro levels. The participatory and decentralized governance of Gandhigram Rural Institute strives for achieving global standard of excellence in all the dimensions of education without compromising on its rural character and Gandhian values.

In the context of sustainable development, rural extension has a very essential role to play. The responsibilities of Extension Service Providers (ESP) need to be comprehensive and holistic in contents and scope. It is more than the technology transfer. It normally aims at the task of disseminating appropriate technologies and good practices.

Higher Education Institute (HEI) as an Extension agency need to exercise a more proactive and participatory role and serve as Knowledge and Information "Providers", initiating and facilitating mutually meaningful and equitable knowledge-based transactions among community, researchers, trainers, and other stakeholders. The new trends and developments to be integrated in rural extension are concerned with the fields of

- Approaches and Methods: Participation and other new approaches in adult education, farmer field schools, market orientation and value chains, livelihood concepts, knowledge and innovation systems;
- Structures and Organizational Issues: Privatization, decentralization, partnership and new dynamics in rural development;
- Extension Aids and Media Use: Ongoing digitalization, digital photography and video, classical internet services, including search engines, web services, opening up new dimensions of access to information, of e-learning and distance learning, and of networking among professionals as well as among clients.

In this context, it is pertinent to have an understanding of the field level experiences which the GRI as an Extension Service Provider (ESP) managed the Extension Services during 2020-21 academic year. It is an extra ordinary situation during 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 situation and resultant lock-down for a long period. It is a major challenge for the GRI to take anything to the field level. Hence, there were few initiatives taken up during 2020-21 to reach the village community and also educate the

Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) Gandhigram - 624 302. Dindigul Dist, Tamilnadu. students on the rural issues. The following three sections provides the attempts made during the year 2020-21.

Section-1: Awareness of the GRI's Students on Rural Issues

In view of Covid-19 situation students were not placed in the villages as part of Village Placement Programme (VPP) during 2020-21 academic year. However, designed a process and obtained data from the students on their awareness of rural issues. It is considered as methods for "Experiential Learning" which is the prime goal of Village Placement Programme (VPP). The UG and PG students who were studying third semester during the academic year 2020-21 have participated in the survey. The survey was conducted on-line during December 2020.

In this section of the Report, data on the level of awareness of the students on rural issues is presented. The survey was conducted as on-line and 817 students studying in third semester during July-December 2020 have participated. The major findings and inferences are given below:

Profile of the Students

- A majority (73.9%) of the students have come from Rural area. A large majority of the students (56.8%) are from backward community followed by Scheduled caste (22.3%) families.
- A considerable number of students are from the families which depend on daily wage income (42.8%) followed by families involved in agriculture (20%). However, a considerable number of students have come from families depend on income from salary and business.
- About 12.4 per cent of the students are first generation to go for higher education as their parents are illiterates. About 42 per cent of the students have come from landless families.
- About 54 per cent of the students have come from a long distance i.e, above 50 kilometers from GRI Campus. At the same time about 45 per cent of the students are located at place which less 50 kilometers from GRI Campus It may be understood that the GRI is serving to the educational needs of the people who are living around the campus.

The profile of the students reveals that a large majority of rural students are studying in GRI. Likewise, opportunity provided for more of SC and Backward Caste students. Thus, the GRI is working towards inclusive development. As the Institute is providing education to the children from the families depend on wage earning and farming as their livelihood. It implies that the poor are enabled by the GRI to get access to the higher education. It is also noticed that about 12 per cent of the students are with illiterate parents which implies these students are "first generation" to step into higher educational institution. It is also noticed that about 68 per cent of the parents who have completed only school level education. It implies that the GRI has given platform to the less endowed families to have access to higher education.

Entry of the student into GRI

The survey covered some important aspects about the source of information about GRI and what are the factors that made the students to join for the higher studies in GRI.

Students' Motive to join the GRI

The students have enlisted some the important factors which motivated them to join in the GRI for their higher education, they are

- Availability of more facilities such as laboratories, library, hostels and playground
- The institute is under the Central Government administration
- The Institute has well experienced Professors
- The student -centered system followed that include Gurukula system, Best Coaching, Ragging free campus, Integrated Programmes (UG and PG, B.Ed)
- Best place to pursue Post-Graduate programme at less expenditure
- Opportunities for extra-curricular programmes like, Shanti Sena and Sports

Students' Expectations from GRI

In the survey the students have suggested for improving some services and include few facilities in the GRI. Mostly they are related to aspects such as

- Building communication skills among students
- Campus interview for various programmes
- Career guidance and Counseling to achieve the goal
- Remedial Coaching to help the students in slow pace of learning
- Research oriented teaching for PG students, to facilitate a career in the scientific, research.

Mostly the rural students came to know about the GRI through Newspaper, School Teachers, Friends and Relatives. However, one of the major sources of information about GRI is happened to be the alumni (old students).

Students' Awareness of Facilities in the Villages

The survey attempted to know the awareness of the students about the facilities available in their villages. The survey reveals that they are aware of the common facilities available in their village and nearby area, they are such as

- Mostly students are aware of the common facilities drinking water facilities, Post office, Hospital, Police station, Polling Station (for election)
- They are also aware of the existing Anganwadi, Library, Market, Medical Shop, Milk Collection Unit, Bank branch

The students are aware of the common facilities available in their area. It implies that they might have used these facilities available.

Students' Awareness on rural issues problems

According the responses provided by the students, the major issues and problems in the villages

- are
 - Lack of Health Care facility, at the reachable distance
 - Lack of adequate Toilet facility
 - Lack of adequate drinking water supply or 24 hours water supply
 - Lack of proper road (black-top road)
 - Lack of drainage facility

Apart from these issues, the students are aware of the social issues and problems which are experienced by them in their village, they are

- Child Marriage and abuse
- Caste discrimination
- Wage discrimination particularly for women labour

The Government, NGOs, CBOs, Panchayats and other agencies have taken some of the initiatives and steps in order to solve the major issues and problems.

- Government has appointed a doctor / health worker / nurse to visit the villages at frequent to identify the health issues and provide appropriate treatment at initial stage of the diseases.
- Gram Panchayat has built Integrated women sanitary complex to support the women to cultivate the health hygienic practice among the village women
- Gram panchayat has made provision to build the houses through Government Free Housing Schemes at free of cost to the SC/STs
- Panchayat Raj Institutions and other stakeholders have created the awareness on social issues such as child marriage and abuse, gender sensitization programmes among the village people.
- Government along with other stakeholders (NGOs / CBOs/ VOs) have created adequate awareness among the villages people about the Gender equality and equity.
- Gram Panchayat has made facilities to provide drinking water at the door step (Individual and street tap)
- Government and other stakeholders have taken appropriate action against the plastic use which completely banned the plastic carry bags usage at village level.
- Gram Panchayat has created awareness and training about the rain water harvesting and waste management (solid waste management)
- Formation of NGOs to support the women for financial stability and empowerment
- Gram Panchayat has made provision to provide all eligible villagers to employment through MGNREGS
- Gram Panchayat has taken steps to create community assets through MGNREGS
- Government has steps to sort-out the one of the major issues of transformation through Mini Bus service to cover all the remote villages which are connecting other major transportation service.

Students' Suggestions to solve the problems in villages

The students of GRI have suggested to solve the issues and problems which exist in villages. The suggestions are

- Create adequate social awareness among the village people and also provide skills upgradation training to enable their economic freedom
- The liquor shops should be removed from the society to solve the social evils
- Implementation of the Government Schemes and Programmes with the consultation of the people well in advance
- Promote the health hygienic practices among village people through providing awards and rewards and appreciation
- Promote in administration with transparency and accountability at all level
- Gram Panchayat activities should be strengthened with adequate funds and power, the people should be acted as key players which can be done through proper communication like display the grants received and spending details

Precautionary measures taken in villages during COVID-19 situation

The students have observed that during the Covid-19, village people have taken precautionary measures to protect their family and society by following the Stand Operating Procedure [SOP] released by Government of India. The precautionary measures taken and followed are

- Using Mask, Sanitizers, Social Distancing
- Practicing the conventional method which consisted the herbal leaves and other ingredients like ginger
- Conventional food have taken to generate the immunity
- Using the Bleaching powder throughout the villages
- Frequently body temperature checked
- Avoid frequent visit of outside

Impact of COVID-19 in the Village

The students have noticed the some impact due to the Covid-19 situation in their villages. They

- are
- Unemployment
- Closure of Educational institutions have completely affected the entire system of education
- It created the distrust of others and always in fear
- It made changes in habits particularly food habit and physical
- It increased the stress level while staying at home always
- It made the food shortage
- It made the climatic condition/ pollution free environment
- It has made the opportunity to spend a lot of time with the family members and strengthen the fondness of the family connection
- It reduce the family expenditure

The preceding discussion reveals that the students are well aware of the situation around them in the village level. They are also enable to suggest alternatives to address the situation in the rural area. The exposure given to the students in the first year of their studies could enable them to understand the rural issues and situation.

Section -2: Covid-19 Lock-Down and its Effects on the School Children - A Micro-Level Study

With the out-break of Covid-19 and resultant lock-down situation, the daily routine of the students and their behavior might have been affected. In this background, an attempt is made to understand the awareness of rural students' in the present living environment and also adoption of certain precautionary measures to avert infection by COVID-19. The focus of the study was to identify and analyze the effect of the COVID-19 among the rural school students. Who are studying at Secondary and Higher Secondary levels. Study has attempted to bring out, how far the students are able to respondent to the situation? and how they learned to cope-up with situation in terms of their awareness on COVID-19. Precautionary steps followed as suggested in the COVID-19 Protocol and SOP. The study was an exploration of the existing situation in the villages, particularly how far the rural school students are able to face the pandemic situation with given socio-economic settings.

The study conducted among 300 school going students. Specifically students were selected from the Secondary level (9th and 10th standard) and Higher Secondary level (11th and 12th standard) in the selected villages of Dindigul District during the lockdown period. The sample respondents were drawn in selected seven villages that are- Chettiapatti, Valaiyapatti, Samiyarpatti, Annanagar, Thoppampatti,

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Eranagampatti and Kalikkampatti of Dindigul District, Tamil Nadu. Samples selected based on the stratified sampling [with replacement method] by taking class in the school as stratum. These villages are service villages of the Gandhigram Rural Institute and also serve as Social Laboratory.

Major Findings and Conclusions

- Majority (71 percentage) of the students have come from the families which were depend on wage income; Only about 17 percentage of the students have come from the families which eke their income from auto driving, retailing, cafeteria. However a small number (11%) of families were eking their livelihood from farming.
- The study revealed that only 38 per cent of Boys and Girls have been wearing a mask while going outside; likewise 35 per cent of the Boys and Girls have followed the system of covering mouth while coughing. However, it is observed that only few Boys and Girls (16.6%) have been frequently washing hands and face. It is also noticed that only a few Boys and Girls (10%) have followed the system of keeping social distance from others.
- The students of the BC community have given high priority for washing hands and face frequently (56%) and also wearing mask when they were going outside from home (55%). The students of MBC community have given priority for washing hands and face frequently (28%) and covering mouth while coughing (27%). The students of SC community have given much priority for keep social distance with others (60%) and also for covering mouth while coughing (43%).
- The study reveals that majority (71%) of the students from the wage income depending families have given high importance to all four preventive measures, they are covering mouth while coughing, keep social distance with others, wearing mask going outside from home and also frequently washing hands and face.
- The study noted that majority (61%) of the students responded woke up in the morning between 6 to 7 am during the Covid-19 lockdown period. It was also noticed that 34.7 per cent woke up before 6 am and few 4.3 per cent have slept for a long time after 7 am.
- The study understood that the majority (58.3%) of the students have spent 1 2 hours in a day for interaction in the social media. One-third of the total students have spent their time of 2 3 hours, few students (11.7%) have spent more than 3 hours in a day on watching happenings and following events in the social media.
- The study found that a majority (41%) of the students have attended the online class continuously through the mobile phone and it causes some physical inconvenience such as headache and neck-pain. 19.3 per cent of the students have eye irritation and swelling and 17.3 per cent were unable to sit continuously.
- The study showed that the students (7.7%) were unable to understand the lessons during the online classes. 9.3 per cent expressed that they were unable to clear their doubts and some students were also facing lack of network and electricity supply during the online classes which hampers their learning process of the students.
- The study evidenced that majority (48.3%) of the students have become stress due to constraints faced on the on-line classes. Some proportion of the students (26.7%) was crying and about 12 per cent each have outburst of anger and depression as their emotions due to the constraints faced by the on-line classes.
- The study disclosed that majority (58%) of the students were unable to meet their friends and relatives during lockdown period. It is noticed that sizable proportion of students (42%) has stated that they could contact friends and relatives only through the mobile and other facilities.

Conclusions: During the Covid-19 pandemic period, lockdown have distressed all the sectors of the World economy in general and the Educational sector in particular. The learning opportunities has been changed into digital and virtually doing things for taking as safety measure. This changed pedagogy of learning system happened to the rural children caused behavioral changes made worried about their lives. Online learning has been the solution and the bridge for connecting the teaching-learning process during lockdown periods. The study concluded that the high school and higher secondary school students of both boys and girls of rural children of Dindigul District, Tamil Nadu have awareness on the Covid-19 Standard protocols. The interventions of Government and Non-Governmental organizations have provided appropriate measures and actions to prevent infection of corona virus among rural community.

Section - 3: Intervention by Gandhigram Crèche Project

A micro level study has found that the families of the school children are aware of the precautionary measures to avoid the quick spread of Covid-19. However they were not able to frequently use washing of hands and face and also use of mask when they go outside from their home. It is understood that the majority (71%) of the students are from the wage earning families; rest of the students are from the farming families (11%) and depend on small business (18%) as their family income. Based on these findings it may be decoded that the families of the students have the problem of affordability to purchase and use disinfectants. It is also observed during the period of study that due to lockdown the families are compelled to be at home. Therefore it is difficult for the families of the students to purchase required disinfectants.

On observing the field level situation, the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension as designed an intervention package to enable these rural families to face the situation during the lockdown. The intervention was planned and executed in the villages where this study was carried out with the support of the Gandhigram Crèche Project. The intervention has two dimensions, the first one focused on educating the school children in the selected villages. The second dimension of the intervention covers the distribution of a Medical Kit which includes Soap, Sanitizer, a set of 5 Masks. This intervention was made in the selected families in the study area. This kind of intervention was carried out during October 2020 by sourcing resources were sourced under project namely Gandhigram Crèche Project. The material distribution was mainly done for the demonstration purpose.

An innovative effort was made to address the livelihood issue of the selected families in the study area. The Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension with the resources available in the Gandhigram Crèche Project distributed Rice, Dhal and Oil to the poor families in the study area. This measure was initiated so, that enabled the families to have nutritious food to increase their immunity in the Covid-19 environment. The Gandhigram Rural Institute as an higher education institution has demonstrated that based on the findings of the study could intervene in a limited way to support the poor families in the selected villages. The study created an opportunities to have similar research on school children to further pro into the happenings during 2021 when the second wave of Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown was imposed.



About GRI NSS Cell

A team of dedicated disciples and contemporaries of Mahatma Gandhi, Dr.T.S.Soundaram and Dr.G.Ramachandran established The Gandhigram Rural Institute in 1947. The Gandhigram Rural Institute was created to promote rural development. Today, it has become a nationally and internationally recognized university for its contribution to ruralhigher education.

The NSS (National Service Scheme) Cell in the Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) was started in the academic year 1979-1980. It has organized several programmes to tune the personality of the student volunteers to make them responsible for rural development. The unique feature of NSS in GRI is that all the students studying Diploma, Undergraduate, and Postgraduate (except for one-year programmes) are NSS volunteers. There are 19 NSS units in the GRI NSS Cell. Shramadhan, tree plantation on campus and in the adopted villages and blood donation to the people admitted to the Kasturba Hospital, Gandhigram and Government Hospital, Dindigul are regular features. 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

Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Gandhigram a technology transfer centre for Agriculture and allied areas like Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Home Science and forest production was started functioning from 7th July 1989. This scheme sanctioned by ICAR accepting the proposal submitted by the School of Agriculture and Animal Sciences of Gandhigram Rural Institute – Deemed University in the year 1987. The financial support is given by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi. Our Kendra caters the needs of the farming community, Self Help Groups, Rural Youths, farmers produce organization and extension personnel of Dindigul District, through various programmes like trainings, On Farm Testings, Front Line Demonstrations and Advisory services. This kendra has established various demonstration units with emphasis to exhibit the resent technologies in Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, and Home Science enterprises so that, year round income can be generated by the farming community.



Mandated Activities:

- Conducting on-farm testing to identify the location specificity of agricultural technologies under various farming systems.
- Organizing frontline demonstrations to establish production potential of various crops and enterprises on the farmers' fields.
- Organizing need based training of farmers to update their knowledge and skills in modern agricultural technologies related to technology assessment, refinement and demonstration, and training of extension personnel to orient them in the frontier areas of technology development.
- Creating awareness about improved technologies to larger masses through appropriate extension programmes.
- Production and supply of good quality seeds and planting materials, livestock, poultry and fisheries breeds and products and various bio-products to the farmingcommunity.
- Work as resource and knowledge centre of agricultural technology for supporting hitiatives of public, private and voluntary sector for improving the agricultural economy of the district. **REGISTRAR** Gandhigram Rural Institute
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Functional Objectives

For fulfilling the prescribed mandate, the KVKs, at present, has to perform the following functions:

- 1) To plan and conduct survey of the operational area and characterize physical and human resources with special reference to identifying the technological and training needs of the farming community.
- 2) To compile all relevant recommendations/package of practices for the district to be meaningfully utilized in the training programmes and the follow-up extension activities.
- 3) To plan and conduct production-oriented and need-based short and long duration training courses both on the campus as well as in the villages for various target groups.
- 4) To organize Farm Science Clubs in order to inculcate in the younger generations a scientific temper and an interest on agriculture and allied sciences and for scientific farming through supervised individual and group projects.
- 5) To develop and maintain the campus farms and demonstration units on scientific lines as the facilities for providing work experience to the trainees, dissemination of the latest technical know-how and also as a means to achieve financial sustainability in due course of time.
- 6) To provide practical training facilities of the Kendra to the teachers and the students of vocational agriculture of the higher secondary schools.
- 7) To provide added training facilities in the area for home making and nutrition education for rural communities and gradually enlarging the training facilities to encompass other important areas such as home/rural crafts and cottage industries with the requirements of the integrated rural development in collaboration with the concerned organizations.
- 8) To implement all such schemes of the ICAR and other related organizations which intend to strengthen the training and technology dissemination programmes as well as follow-up extension activities of the Kendra.
- 9) To undertake on-farm testing of the technologies developed by the National Agricultural Research System (NARS) in agriculture and allied fields for their suitability and identifying the constrains.
- 10)To demonstrate the potentialities of various technologies and recommend for their adoption in maximizing yield/income per unit of time and area under different resource conditions.

Details of Activities Performed By KVK

1. Technology Assessment and Refinement

Technology Assessment and Refinement (TAR) refers to a set of procedures whose purpose is to develop recommendations for a particular agro-climatic situation/ location through assessment and refinement of recently released technology through participatory approach.

2. Frontline Demonstration

Front-Line Demonstration (FLD) is a concept of field demonstration conducted under the close supervision of scientists of the National Agriculture Research System the technologies are demonstrated for the first time by the scientists themselves before being fed into the main extension system of the State Department of Agriculture.

3. Trainings

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The following trainings are organized and conducted.

Training for farmers (On and Off Campus)

> The trainings are organized to disseminate needed technologies to farmers

Training for rural youth (On and Off Campus)

> The rural youth were trained in agricultural technologies and also essential skill in a particular enterprise

Training for extension personnel (On and Off Campus)

The technologies needed for solving a particular farming problem and newly identified technologies apt for the district are disseminated to extension workersin government and Non-Government sector.

Sponsored training programmes (On and Off Campus)

The financial assistance are sought from external agency for organizing trainingsto farmers, rural youth and extension personnel

Vocational training programmes (On and Off Campus)

> Vocational trainings are organized to impart skill and knowledge of a particular trade or enterprise to develop a trainee as a business man. This trainings are organized for farmers and rural vouth

On Campus Trainings are organized at KVK when the target trainees are frommore than one village Off Campus Trainings are organized at any place other than KVK, when the target trainees are from one area.

4. Extension Activities

The various extension activities are carried out as follows

Method Demonstration: A method demonstration is given before a group of people to show how to carry out an entirely new practices or an old practice in a better way. It is essentially a skill training, where the emphasis is on effectively carrying out a job, which shall improve upon the result. It involves seeing, hearing, participating and practicing in a group whichshall stimulate interest and action.

Farmers' Field Schools (FFS): FFS consists of a group of people with a common interest who get together on a regular basis to study the "how or why" of a particular topic. The topic covered can vary considerably from IPM, organic agriculture, and husbandry etc, to income generating activities such as handicrafts.

Field Day: A field day is a day in which an area containing successful farming or other practices is open for people to visit. This way, a group of farmers could witness the performance or results of certain practice (s) under local conditions. Field days could be planned to deal with one specific topic at a time or a number of items of interest to the farmers. The purpose of the field day is to permit extension clientele to observe personally, ask about successful and locally applicable practices, and to create a situation in which informal contacts and learning can take place. Field days are normally held once or twice a year. usually in each crop season. They are held on farmers' fields, regional research stations, agricultural universities and government farms to demonstrate successful farming techniques or research.

Exhibition: Exhibition is a planned and systematic display of real objects, specimens, models, charts and posters presented to public view for instruction, judging a competition, advertising or entertainment. It helps to create awareness, develop interests and stimulate action amongst the public. It accommodates both exhibits and display.

Displays use two dimensional or flat materials like pictures, photograph, chart, posters etc, while exhibits tend to use more three dimensional materials like realobjects, specimens and models.

Field Visit: Visit to successful farmers' fields in addition to KVK farms to reinforce the relevant technologies imparted in the training programme. The principle of "seeing is believing" can be fulfilled. Field visit gives participants exposure to the real life situation and also provide an idea about the possible solutions to the problems. By this, the farm specific technologies can given to each farmer.

Awareness Campaign: It is an intensive teaching activity undertaken at an opportune time for a brief period, focusing attention in a concerted manner on a particular problem, with a view to stimulate the widest possible interest in a community. Campaigns are launched only after a recommended practice has been found acceptable to the people as a result of other extension methods. Its purpose is to encourage emotional participation of a large number of people and to foster a favourable psychological climate for quick and large scale adoption of improved practices.

The other extension activities carried by the KVK include Advisory Services through over phone, Celebration of Important days, Animal/Plant Health Clinic, Diagnostic visit to the farms, Exposure Visit of farming community to successful farmers field, Research Institutes etc., Farm Science Club, Farmers Seminar/Workshop, farmers Group Discussions, Film show, Kisan Mela, Serving as Resource persons for other departments/agencies, meeting/workshop with Extension Personnel, Animal Treatment camps, Publications of Pamphlet, Folder, Leaflets, Popular Articles, Radio and TV talks, News overage etc. The Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) – Annual Report (2020-21) REGISTRAR Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) Paper coverage etc.

Emergency Fund Activities of the COVID-19 Pandemic Gandhigram Creche and Children's Project



Gandhigram Creche and Children's Project organized the COVID-19 Emergency Fund activities during July and October 2020. In the month of July, the Funding Agency (Afnonlus) of the SAD, Focolare Movement, Italy had sent letters to all the implementing agencies to prepare proposals for receiving the COVID-19 Emergency Funds. We sent the proposal to them. The (Funding Agency) had permitted us to use the grant of Rs.1,65,000/- only from the previous year balance amount of Rs.6,47,056 for the poor families of Gandhigram Creche and Children's Project (children and parents).

The following activities were carried out under Covid-19 Emergency Fund.

- 1. Distributed medical kits to the children of the Gandhigram Creche and Children's Project
- 2. Provided financial assistance to ten poor families (who have lost their jobs) for their daily requirements like food, medicine, clothing and for their economic upliffment in general
- 3. Provided financial assistance to three students who have to be admitted in college

Organization of logistics for the concrete development of the activities:

- 1. Purchased the things required for medical kits
- 2. Distributed medical kits
- 3. Provided economical assistance to the families
- 4. Arranged suitable colleges for the children to join, and provided educational assistance
- 5. The existing staff had taken care of the above activities

Administrative aspects of the management:

- 1. 1. Prepared the proposal for the funding agency
- 2. 2.Received the fund from the funding agency
- 3. 3. The Principal Coordinator administered the above activities by the help of the staff members
- 4. 4. While carrying out all the activities proper awareness was created on social distancing, wearing the mask, hand washing and always being alert about Covid-19 pandemic.

The total number of children in our project is 166. Medical kits were planned to be distributed to the families of these children. The number of parents, grandparents and siblings is 434. The total number of family members is 600. Two masks were distributed to each member. Therefore totally 1200 masks were stitched .Along with the masks, two soaps, one sanitizer and an ayurvedic powder packet to increase children's immunity were given to the families in each bag. Therefore 166 bags were made ready

for 166 families. All the three items were purchased from the Gandhigram Khadi Gramodvog (Village Industries) Store. Khadi (hand spun and hand woven) materials were bought from the Khadi Store to stitch masks. The masks were stitched by two women of the Self - help groups for their

Two students of our project , Sabarishri and Masilamani , from Thopampatti village volunteered to pack the medical kits by the supervision of our staff members. 

GRI-RCI organized Online Interaction Programme on Proposal Development for Community Engagement on 19.6.2020 in collaboration with National Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad. Dr.V.P.R.Sivakuamar, Registrar, GRI, inaugurated and dedicated the Domestic Incinerator for the safe disposal of Corona Virus Masks at Vaddakku Sillukkanpatti Village, Thoothukudi District on 21.12.2020. This Project was commissioned by the UBA unit of the VOC College, Thoothukudi. The UBA unit of St.Mary's College, Thoothukudi organized series of self-employment training to the women in the adopted villages. Training on Nutritious Novel Snacks Preparation

During the pandemic providing nutritious meals to children and to improve their immunity and nutritional status is a challenging task for parents. Realising this need Unnat Bharat Abhiyan in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra organized a one day training programme on Nutritious Novel Snacks Preparation to the crèche workers of Gandhigram Rural Institute. They in turn will impart the knowledge to the rural mothers. This programme was organized on 29th December 2020 at Gandhigram.

Smt. M. Annamary Selvi, Balwadi Supervisor delivered Welcome Address. Dr. L. Raja, Professor and Head, Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, in his presidential address pointed out that good nutrition is very much essential for children who are in vulnerable situation. During Pandemic the mothers need to be educated about preparing nutritious diet with the resources available to them.



REGISTRAR Gandhigram **Hime Ganstibigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) – Annual Report (2020-21)** (Deemed to be University) Gandhigram - 624 302. Dindigul Dist, Tamilnadu. Mrs.Curlin, CDPO from Athoor, explained the efforts to be taken to improve the nutritional status of children during the pandemic period where the noon meal centres. She also stressed the need of preparing snacks at home which is more hygienic and healthy. She demonstrated the preparation of Aval balls, millet rolls, The crèche workers actively involved in the preparation of tasty and nutritious snacks and taken a oath that each will impart the knowledge and skill gained through this training programme to at least five rural mothers. Thus this programme is intended to cover rural mothers in UBA adopted villages of Gandhigram. At the end of the programme, Dr.S. Kavitha Maithily, Coordinator proposed vote of thanks to the resource person and the participants.

Discussion with Rural Women on Herbal Collection

Under UBA it is planned to create an employment opportunity for rural women based on their local resources. In valayapatti village many families are engaged in collecting the herbs from sirumalai hills and selling it to the local traders. So it is thought that if training is given to make the herbs collected into a value added product, the income of rural women could be enhance. With this intention an initial discussion was held with the herb collectors at valayapatti on 18.02.21. This meeting was arranged to identify how many women are engaged in this activity, what are the various



types of herbs they are collecting and the seasons when the herbs are available. It was understood that 15 to 20 women are engaged in this activity. When they don't have MGNREGA work, they will go for herbal collection. They will collect the herbs, just sun dry it and sell it to the traders at Dindigul. They don't have any knowledge or idea on processing technology or making the herbs into value added products like tea bags, facial packs etc. Still more exploratory interviews need to be conducted in this regard. As summer is approaching no hers were available at this season. It was decided to have further discussions and to find a suitable training programme for these women.

Training on Mushroom Cultivation

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, GRI organized a training programme on Mushroom Cultivation to 30 SHG women on 17.02.2021 along with Krishi Vigyan Kendra of GRI. In order to provide livelihood opportunities to rural women this

Mrs M. Sahintaj, SMS, KVK explained the benefits of mushroom cultivation and how to maintain and grow it, and the processing method. Mushroom farming is one of the most profitable agri-business that you can start with low investment and less space. Button mushroom, oyster mushroom and paddy straw mushroom are the three significant types used for Indian cultivation. Paddy straw mushrooms can grow in temperatures ranging from 35-40 degree Celsius. On the other hand, oyster mushrooms grow during the winter seasons. All these mushrooms of commercial importance are grown by different methods and techniques. Mushrooms are grown in unique beds known as compost beds.

A pure culture of Pleurotus sp. (oyster mushrooms) needs for inoculation on the sterilized substrate. It takes 10-15 days for mycelial growth on cereal grains. Oyster mushroom can cultivate many agro-wastes with cellulose and lignin, which helps in more enzyme production of cellulose correlated with more yield. These include straw of paddy, wheat and ragi, stalk and leaves of maize, millets and cotton, used citronella leaf, sugarcane bagasse, sawdust, jute and cotton waste, dehulled corncobs, pea nut shells, dried grasses, sunflower stalks, used tea leaf waste, discarded waste paper and synthetic compost of button mushrooms. It has reported that jowar and baira grains are superior to wheat grains. Freshly prepared (20-30 days old) grain spawn is best for spawning. Old spawn (3-6 months) stored at room temperature (at 20-30° C) forms a very thick mat-like structure due to mycelium aggregation, and sometimes young pinheads and fruit bodies start developing in the spawn bottle itself. Spawned bags, trays or boxes are arranged in a dark cropping room on raised platforms or shelves for mycelium colonization of the substrate. However, mycelium can grow from 10°Cto 33° C; the optimum temperature for spawn running lies between 22°C to 26°C. When the mycelium has fully colonized the substrate, the fungus is ready for fruiting. Contaminated bags with molds may be discarded, while bags with patchy mycelia growth may be left for few more days to complete mycelial growth. The correct shape for picking canbe judge by the shape and size of the fruit body. The fruit bodies should be harvest before spore release by twisting so that the stubs are not left on the beds (straw). It is advisable to pick all the mushrooms from a cube, and the next flush will appear at one time. More than 500 kg of fresh mushrooms per ton of dry wheat or straw can be obtained in the case of crops produced in 45-60 days.

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The trainees were given hands on training to fill the bags and how to spread the seeds and hang. They also visited the mushroom cultivation unit and understands the steps in cultivation. Thus they learnt the concepts through learning by doing method
