





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#### **Executive Summary**

#### Introduction

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) traces its origins to 1947, the year of India's independence. Gandhigram, a village purposely named after the father of the Nation, was established by a team of disciples of Babuji, led by Dr.T.S.Soundram and Dr.G.Ramachandran with a view to providing higher education to the rural youth and to train them as social engineers who would serve the rural masses and contribute to the reconstruction of rural India.

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) was established in the year 1956, under the auspices of the National Council for Rural Higher Education (Ministry of Human Resource Development / Ministry of Education, Government of India) as one of the 11 Rural Institutes established in various parts of the country. Right from its inception, GRI has founded its educational principles on the revolutionary concept of *Nai Talim*, a new system different from the mainstream of western higher education in India, with extension as the central focus, linking teaching and research.

While all the other 10 rural institutes got affiliated to their neighbouring universities, GRI established its name by steadfastly pursuing its mission of taking higher education to the rural masses. This Institute has its genesis in the extension programmes conducted in the rural environs which made extension as the pivotal component of education.

GRI, since its inception, has been rendering yeomen service by empowering the rural populace through educational and extension services. The educational model blended with Gandhian ideologies was recognized as a pioneering practice to educate and train social architects for integrated rural development. In recognition of its noble and relentless services rendered in the realm of the triangulated dimension of higher education, namely, teaching, research, and extension, GRI was conferred with the status of a Deemed to be University in August 1976 by the University Grants Commission. The Institute is governed by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, and is fully funded by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

The curricular model developed at GRI integrating teaching, research and extension earned the Institute the status of a Deemed to be University in 1976, from UGC. GRI was one among the two universities in Tamil Nadu accredited with the Five Star Status by NAAC in 2002 (1st Cycle). Subsequently, it was accredited with 'A' Grade in the 2nd and 3rd cycles in 2010 and 2016 respectively. In the NIRF ranking ladder, the institute was placed in the rank band 151-200 among universities of the country in NIRF 2022; GRI has been ranked the rank band 101-150 in NIRF 2021, 91st in 2020, 75th rank in 2019, 79th rank in 2018 and 91st rank in 2017among universities.

The functional framework of GRI is deep-rooted in Gandhian ideologies of education and extension and its core objectives are: to provide instruction and training in such branches of learning as will promote a classless and casteless society; to provide for research and advancement and dissemination of framework; and to function as a centre for extension work leading to integrated rural development.

GRI has eight schools, eighteen departments and nine centres, apart from the Central Library, Physical Education and DDU-Kaushal Kendra. Under this academic setup, GRI offers 62 academic programmes ranging from certificate courses to doctoral programmes. As per statutory requirements, select programmes offered by GRI are approved by AICTE and NCTE.

The quality of teaching and learning at GRI is assured by 111 well-qualified, experienced and committed faculty members. The vigour of research on campus is promoted by 488 research scholars and 3 post-doctoral fellows. As many as 104 permanent non-teaching and technical staff offer support to teaching, research and extension activities. To meet the needs of the ever increasing student strength, 148 Adhoc teachers have also been appointed.

#### **Academic Programmes**

The curricular design of the programmes offered at GRI pivot on core and allied skill development of the graduating students with due provisions to imbibe social and cultural values and help the students emerge as social architects. The institute is determined to develop socially responsible and professionally

competent graduates to meet the demands for human resources in educational, industrial, research and development and social service sectors. The institute offers mandatory value-based courses on "Gandhi's Life, Thought and Work" and "Gandhi in Everyday Life" in order to implant Gandhian values in the younger generation.

During 2021-2022, GRI offered 22 PG (2 years), 6 PG Diploma (one year), 2 Five-year Integrated, 5 UG (4 years), 11 UG (3 years), 8 B.Voc. (3 years), 3 Diploma (2 years), One Diploma (one year), 2 D.Voc. (1 year) and One Certificate programmes apart from B.Ed. Programme. The Institute follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) regulations of the UGC. Out of the 1499 students who appeared for the End Semester Examinations, 1332 students passed, constituting a pass percentage of 89. The number of Ph.D. degrees awarded during the year was 70. The institute has been following the semester examination pattern since 1976. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is in practice since 1996.

#### Admission

Gandhigram Rural Institute adopted online admission system and was able to reach graduating aspirants from across the country and beyond, during 2021-2022. The number of applications received through online registration was 32252 out of which 30112 applications were found eligible. Out of this, 1617 students were admitted to various academic programmes offered during the year. As in the previous years, female students have outnumbered male students. Though the majority of enrolled students are from Tamil Nadu, GRI has also attracted students from other states of India, namely the Bihar, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Pondicherry and Telengana West Bengal. The enrolment for Ph.D. programmes was 72. GRI follows the reservation policy of the Government of India as well as the norms laid by UGC. Admissions are strictly based on merit.

#### **Funded Research Projects**

Funded projects are a functional entity of the research culture and climate of a higher educational institution. The faculty members of GRI submitted 88 project proposals to funding agencies, namely, UGC, DST, CSIR, ISRO, BRNS, IRMA, ICSSR, RGNIYD, DRDO, DBT, ICMR, PCRA, KSCSTE, NISE, AICTE, MNRE, NBHM and State Planning Commission, Tamil Nadu with a total budget outlay of Rs.34.12 crores. A sum of Rs.1.20 crores have been received during the period under report.

At the department level, five departments have received funds under UGC-SAP and two departments under DST-FIST (Level I & II).

#### Conferences / Workshops / Seminars Organized

Being a vibrant educational and research hub, GRI regularly organizes a number of programmes to create platforms for knowledge sharing and dissemination on the latest trends and technologies. During the year under report, 80 programmes were organized viz., 1 International Conference, 1 International Workshop, 4 International Training / Special Lecture programmes, 7 International Webinars, 10 National Workshops, 13 National level Training / Special Lecture programmes, 11 National Webinars, 1 State level Symposia, 6 State level Training / Special Lecture programmes, 4 University/College level Workshops, 16 Training / Special Lecture programmes and 5 University level Webinars. A total of 12,937 participants, covering faculty members, scientists, research scholars, and students have benefitted through these programmes.

#### Participation in Conferences / Seminars/ Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes

The faculty members are encouraged to augment their domain knowledge, share and upgrade their expertise by participating in academic and research platforms. They have participated in 147 such programs and have presented 44 research articles. Towards knowledge dissemination, faculty members delivered 287 keynote address and invited lectures.

The Institute periodically arranges faculty development programmes and workshops aimed at quality enrichment. Seven faculty members attended Refresher Courses, one faculty member attended a Short Term Courses and 10 faculty members attended Faculty Development Programmes conducted by Human Resource Development Centres of various universities.

#### **Research Publications**

Research is an important dimension of higher educational institutions. In this regard, GRI is putting in its best efforts to enhance its visibility through quality research publications. The faculty members have brought out 236 publications in reputed and refereed journals, including those listed by the UGC during 2021-2022.

The bibliometric details of the publications up to 2023 are: 2911 Scopus (h-index: 88) and 2426 by Web of Sciences (h-index: 82). Additionally, 31 Conference Proceedings, 11 books and 54 chapters in books have been authored by the faculty members. GRI promotes research publication culture among the researchers through its two journals, namely, *Journal of Extension and Research* (ISSN: 0972-351X) and *Gandhigram Literary Review (ISSN: 2278-8190*).

#### **Visits Abroad & International Associations**

The quality of research in GRI has been opening up newer avenues for collaborations / associations with Universities / Colleges overseas. One faculty member was invited to UCSI University, Malaysia during the year under report.

#### **Research Fellowships**

A total of 74 research scholars received funds under UGC-RGNF, UGC-MANF, UGC-EMERITUS, UGC-DSRPDFHS, UGC-SGC, UGC-PDFSS, UGC-PDFWM, UGC-JRF, UGC-SRF, CSIR-SRF, UGC-BSR, UGC-SVSGC, UGC-SJRPFSGC, DST-PDF, DST-Inspire, ICSSR-PDF, ICMR and other schemes.

#### **MoUs and Collaborations**

In 2021-22, GRI has signed 21 MoUs with reputed educational institutions / organizations in addition to 41 collaborations.

GRI has signed an agreement with National Database Management Limited (NDML) for uploading the students' credentials in the National Academic Depository (NAD), and as on date 6042 students have registered on NAD for which a link is provided in the Institute's website. From the year 2021-22 onwards, the NAD is being maintained through DigiLocker.

#### **Extension Programmes**

The extension and outreach activities aimed at integrated rural development are the prime pillars of GRI. For this purpose, Village Placement Programmes (VPP) and Extension Activities are amalgamated suitably into the curriculum of all the programmes offered at GRI. The VPP greatly enables the GRI staff and students to get hands-on experience on the problems and challenges of rural life.

In view of Covid-19 situation students were not placed in the villages as part of Village Placement Programme (VPP) for the academic year 2021-22. However, designed a process and obtained data from the students on their awareness of rural issues. It is considered as methods for "Experiential Learning" which is the prime goal of Village Placement Programme (VPP). The UG and PG students who were studying the academic year 2021-22 have participated in the survey. The survey was conducted through on-line.

As a national recognition, the Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Panchayati Raj and Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation of the Govt. of India have recognized GRI (DU) as a National Level Monitor (NLM).

#### **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan**

UBA 2.0 was launched on April 25, 2018, with the Challenge Mode, wherein all HEIs are required to partner with minimum of five villages willingly for community outreach. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, identified the Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) as one of the Regional Centres for UBA in March 2019 covering State of Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telengana and Union Territories of Puducherry, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep.

GRI has adopted nine villages from three Taluks, covered under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) programme of the Government of India. Activities aimed at the upliftment of villages were carried out under UBA.

#### Governance

The Honourable Union Minster of HRD, GoI, is the Chairman of the GRI Society. In 2021-22, the meeting of the Board of Management, the Planning and Monitoring Board, the Academic Council, the Finance Committee and the GRI Society were held.

#### **Finance**

During the FY 2021-2022, GRI received Rs.851000000/- under maintenance grant, against which the expenditure was made to the tune of Rs.732021275/-.

Its credentials, recognitions, accomplishments and action-packed strategic plans would undoubtedly facilitate the institution to attain heights of excellence and reach new horizons of quality assurance and sustenance in higher education.

### **Extension through Community Outreach**

The Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) is being fully funded by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The UGC, New Delhi has developed academic programs in rural development, rural economics and extension education, rural oriented sciences, co-operation, development administration, rural sociology, English, Tamil and Indian languages. The institute is also offering Engineering, Technology related academic and vocational educational programs.

Gandhigram Rural Institute (GRI) is quite active on both campus and off campus (rural areas) in the vicinity, for mutually benefitting and enriching one another. Besides, its contribution in teaching, from Pre-primary, certificate, diploma, degree and all the way to Post-doctorate levels. ## **Department of Sociology**

#### **Profile**

Establishment of the Department coincided with the conferment of the Deemed to be a University status to the Institute in the year 1976 and carrying out Teaching, Research and Extension activities since its inception. Earlier the faculty of this department engaged in offering the only PG course with a thrust on Rural Society in the Institute namely M.A in Rural Services in which Sociology was the Major Component. The nomenclature of this PG course was replaced with M.A in RS&PR (Rural Sociology and Panchayat Raj). Later the same M.A course was changed as Rural Sociology and finally taking into consideration of the felt needs and future of the students, the PG course was modified and re-named as M.A in Sociology in the year 1990. M.A.(5Yr. Int.) Sociology programme is introduced during the academic year 2017-18 in the place of M.A.Sociology programme. The Ph.D. programme was launched in the year 1986 and produced 30 Ph.D. Scholars so far. The M. Phil. Programme in Development Sociology was introduced in the year 1996 with an inter-disciplinary thrust and produced more than 100 M.Phil. Scholars and majority subsequently pursued Ph.D. programme also.

The Department has organized many Seminars, Symposia and Workshops focusing on marginalized communities and also conducted training programmes for the benefit of NGOs, Government organizations and Community Based Organizations (CBOs) in villages with funding support from UGC, ICSSR, MHRD, UNICEF and NFCH etc. As for extension programmes, the PG students have been involved in various kinds of rural reconstruction activities in the service villages of GRI, by adopting the approach of Micro level Planning (MLP) and assignment of five families to each student to show result oriented extension services during the semester period for which students are to submit the report on extension services at the end of each semester. In addition, sensitization and awareness generation programmes with specific reference to social welfare are taken under the scheme of taking the University to the door steps of the villages by adopting the strategy of reaching the unreached. The extension based development intervention has been undertaken within the broad frame work of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and Providing Urban Amenities in Rural Areas (PURA) and Unnath Bahrath Abhiyan (UBA). This exercise is undertaken to link the class room theoretical deliberations with practical field based learning for the students. The social lab/observatory technique adopted in the extension service has made the students to get involved practically in action research based micro level development planning oriented village development endeavors. The department has also facilitated the establishment of the Centre for the Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy in GRI with funding support from UGC in the year 2010 during Xth plan period, initially at a cost of Rs.2 crores and later continued with increased financial support for pursuing inclusive growth through investigations, advocacies, seminars besides teaching, research, extension activities.



#### **About GRI NSS Cell**

A team of dedicated disciples and contemporaries of Mahatma Gandhi, Dr.T.S.Soundaram and Dr.G.Ramachandran established The Gandhigram Rural Institute in 1947. The Gandhigram Rural Institute was created to promote rural development. Today, it has become a nationally and internationally recognized university for its contribution to ruralhigher education.

The NSS (National Service Scheme) Cell in the Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University) was started in the academic year 1979-1980. It has organized several programmes to tune the personality of the student volunteers to make them responsible for rural development. The unique feature of NSS in GRI is that all the students studying Diploma, Undergraduate, and Postgraduate (except for one-year programmes) are NSS volunteers. There are 19 NSS units in the GRI NSS Cell. Shramadhan, tree plantation on campus and in the adopted villages and blood donation to the people admitted to the Kasturba Hospital, Gandhigram and Government Hospital, Dindigul are regular features. 

### Shanti Sena

Shanthi Sena, (Peace Corps) in GRI was founded in 1958, 18 years before becoming a Deemed University. Since, GRI has always been a testing ground for many Gandhian experiments, the founding father of GRI, Dr G. Ramachandran took upon himself the task of establishing within this institution of higher education a nonkilling alternative to military training—a Shanti Sena. Even when GRI, upon becoming a Deemed University, was presented with the choice to adopt National Cadet Corps (NCC), it chose to continue with Shanthi Sena instead. By doing it, GRI became the only educational institution in the whole of globe to have adopted this model.

Combining spiritual, physical, intellectual, and organizational training, the Shanti Sena prepared students for conflict resolution, security functions, disaster relief, and cooperative community service in response to community needs. The approach is always to work together with villagers to improve such things as childcare, sanitation, housing, and preservation of folk arts traditions. The Shanti Sena in GRI until recently assumed responsibility for campus security. No armed police were permitted on GRI campus or if permitted they used to play second fiddle to Shanthi Sena, even during visits by Indian prime ministers Pundit Nehru, Mrs. Indira Gandhi, or Presidents Shri R. Ventkatraman, Shri Abdul Kalaam and other dignitaries. Besides providing security, when such dignitaries and prominent leaders visit the GRI campus, Shanthi Sena remains at the forefront in according them floral tributes and grand welcome.

The six-decade long experience of Shanthi Sena in GRI includes taking initiatives in peace building, promoting democracy and governance by conducting peace dialogues, interreligious dialogues, youth exchange programmes, youth camps, leadership training programmes, sports for peace programmes and prohibition (abolition of arrack) in the neighbouring villages. They are actively involved in emergency relief, peace education, environmental conservation and providing community based health facilities in the rural areas nearby.

Every year, many students of the Institute volunteer to become part of Shanthi Sena and carry rich experiences and fond memories with them when passing out from GRI.



The camp was held at Sevagram from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> December, 2021.



# Report of Short Term Course on Gandhian Thought and Action Organized by Sevagram Ashram Pratistan, Sevagram, Wardha, Maharashtra during December 23-27, 2021

Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan, Wardha organized the Winter Camp/Short Term Course on Gandhian Thought from 23 -27 December 2021 at the premises of the Ashram. In this residential short-term course on Gandhian Thought and action, 48 college/ university students from different parts of India participated. **Participants from The Gandhigram Rural Institute:**

The objective of this short acquaint the students with the life and work of Mahatma Gandhi and its relevance in current predicament. Sri Jamnalal Bajaj Memorial Library Research Centre Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan was instrumental in coordinating this course.



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#### Day 1 (23.12.2021)

Before the inaugural session, a brief introduction about the winter camp was given to the participants to get them acquainted with the camp. Dr. Siby K. Joseph. Director JBMLRC, guided the students. The inaugural function was held on the 23rd morning at Yatri Niwas. Sevagram. The Camp began with the reciting of Mahatma's favorite Bhaian, Shri TRN Prabhu, President of Sevagram Ashram Pratistan welcomed the participants of the camp. In his introductory remarks, he briefly



explained the last will and testament of Gandhi and how Sarva Seva Sangh and Sarvodaya Samaj were formed after the assassination of Mahatma to carry out his mission. Shri Chandan Pal, President of Sarva Seva Sangh inaugurated the camp by lighting the traditional lamp. The dignitaries and resource persons present on the occasion and representatives of students also joined him in lighting the lamp.

#### Inaugural Address - Shri Chandan Pal

In his inaugural address, Shri Chandan Pal stated that Gandhi was not a philosopher like Karl Marx and others. While sharing his experience in the field he stated that though he was engaged in Tsunami relief work, Naxal affected areas, the most memorable was Kokrajhar peace mission in Assam bringing the warring communities into the path of peace. The source of inspiration for this work was Gandhi's peace mission in Calcutta which was described as "the Miracle of Calcutta". He also shared the experience of cycle vatra from Kokraihar to Kashmir with youngsters to spread the message of this mission. It was followed by a question-answer session. Dr.D. John Chellaurai. Professor and HOD. Department of Gandhian Studies, Mahatma Gandhi Mission University, Aurangabad, Shri Bhujang Ramrao Bobade, Founder, Heritage Foundation, Jalgaon.

#### Philosophy and Contemporary Relevance of Sarvodaya

Following the introductory and inaugural session, Shri TRN Prabhu, President of Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan, addressed the students on the philosophy and contemporary relevance of Sarvodava.

#### An introduction to the Life of Gandhi

In order to get acquainted with the life of Gandhi and India's struggle for freedom the documentary viz. Mahatma Gandhi: Life of Gandhi was screened in two parts. This documentary was directed by Vithalbhai K. Jhaveri and produced by the Gandhi Memorial Fund in collaboration with the Films Division, Government of India. In the course of more than two hours, the participants could get a bird's eve view of Gandhi's life and India's unique struggle for freedom based on nonviolence under his quidance.

#### **Concurrent Group Discussion Sessions**

In the last session of the first day, the participants were divided into three groups and Concurrent Group Discussion sessions were held in three halls of Yatri Niwas. Each group selected a topic of contemporary relevance and participants were asked to reflect on the theme. This provided them an opportunity to interact with each other and express their viewpoints on the theme. Dr. John Chelladurai, Shri Bhujang Ramrao Bobade, Dr. M. Arunachalam and Dr. Siby K. Joseph guided the students during the Concurrent Group Discussion sessions.

#### Day 2 (24.12.2021)

#### Fundamentals of Gandhian Thought: Nonviolence as the basis of Truth

On the second day of the camp Dr. D. John Chellaurai, Professor and HOD of Gandhian Studies, Mahatma Gandhi Mission University, Aurangabad shed light on the fundamentals of Gandhian Thought viz. Truth and Nonviolence. The speaker identified different levels of violence/non-violence. He classified them as: passive non-violence and active or dynamic nonviolence.

#### Misconceptions about Mahatma Gandhi

In order to remove the common misconceptions, Gandhi's relationship with some prominent personalities were analysed during the second day of the winter camp. Shri Bhujang Bobade, Director of Heritage Foundation, Jalgaon guided the discussions. Shri Bhujang Bobade in the course of his presentation threw light on the relationship between Gandhi and Ambedkar with the support of historical facts and the literature produced by scholars who have made a systematic study about these two greats

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personalities. He brought into the limelight Gandhi's adherence to an idealized system of varṇāśramadharma and his uncompromising attitude towards untouchability and stand against vivisection of people on the basis of caste. While analyzing the execution of Bhagat Singh and Gandhi's attempt to save his life, Shri Bhujang Bobade stated that these two personalities belonged to entirely different schools of thought, one based on violence and another on nonviolence. Shri Bhujang Bobade also discussed the intricacies of complex relations between Gandhi and Subash Chandra Bose. In the last part of his presentation, he dealt with the question of Gandhi a sympathizer of Muslims and the partition of India.

#### **Christmas Eve Celebration**

The second day of the winter camp concluded with began with Christmas Eve Celebration. The celebration began with a brief message from Shri TRN Prabhu, President of Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan, Wardha about the message of Jesus Christ. It was followed by the performance of certain programmes which were unique to different states of India. Every participant tried to present the best in their States and it was a unique display of Unity in the diversity of our country.



#### Day 3 (25.12.2021)

#### Peace Walk

On the third day of the camp, a Peace Walk was organized in the premises of Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan with five stops. In each stop one of the five basic elements in nature viz. earth, water, fire, air, and space was explained and how it is represented in our body and its interconnection with nature. The purpose of this walk was to understand the laws of nature which govern the universe and how we are integrated with nature and the interconnectedness of all living organisms. At the end of the walk, a sharing of experiences of the walk was organized to understand the specific learning from the exercise and how they use this knowledge to lead a meaningful life with greater social responsibility. The sharing at the end of the walk helped us to know that as a result of the exercise their sensitivity, awareness and mindfulness of the participants were taken to a higher level. Dr.D. John Chellaurai served as the facilitator of the peace walk. Shri TRN Prabhu, Dr. Siby K. Joseph and Shri Bhujang Bobade also took part in the peace walk along with the participants.

#### **Practical demonstration of Soap Making**



A special session / practical demonstration of soap making was arranged with the help of Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Rural Industrialization, Wardha. Mrs. Uma There of Chemical Industries Section of Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Rural Industrialization, Maganvadi, Wardha explained to the participants how to make handmade and transparent soap which everyone can learn without any difficulty. It was followed by a practical demonstration. Sri. Ganesh There of Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Rural Industrialization explained to the

students the various activities of the institution.

#### **Field Visit**

A field visit to the ashram and constructive work organizations in Wardha and other places of historic importance was arranged on the third day. The students visited the Charkha Griha premises at Sevagram Road and saw the largest Charkha, statues of Acharya Vinoba Bhave made out automobile scrap material. In the Charkha museum, we saw documentaries related to Khadi and the 3D documentary on Gandhi. On the way to Wardha, we saw a Christmas crib of the Church. We visited Magan Sangrahalaya, the museum inaugurated by Mahatma Gandhi himself in 1938. Abrief history and present activities of Magan Sangrahalaya were explained to us. In the museum, we saw display of various kinds of Charkhas, khadi, and village industries. They also visited well-known Gandhian economist J. C. Kumarappa's hut. Then students went on a walk to have an overview of the All India Village Industries Association which is now on the campus of the Mahatma Gandhi Institute for Rural Industrialization. Then we visited Goras Bhandar and saw the making of Goras Pak (biscuits).

The next stop was Laxmi Narayan Mandir Wardha. It was the first temple to open its gates to untouchables on 17th July 1928 at the initiative of Jamnalal Bajaj Bhave. Then the participants visited the Centre of Science for Villages, Dattapur. We visited different sections and had the opportunity to see the process of making handmade paper and boards. The last stop was Brahma Vidya Mandir, Paunar. This ashram at Paunar was set up by Vinoba Bhave in 1938. The students saw the room used by Vinoba and 1500-year old sculptures of Ganga, Ram-Bharat Bhet (union), and other numerous sculptures which Vinoba got while digging the land for agriculture.

#### Day 4 (26.12.2021)

#### Why should we wear Khadi?

On the fourth day of the camp, Dr. Ulhas Jajoo (MD), a medical practitioner associated with Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram discussed the philosophy of Khadi and its significance in the decentralized economic order visualized by Mahatma Gandhi.

#### Peace and Sarvodaya

In the ensuing session, Dr. D. John Chellaurai reflected on the concept of peace and how we can achieve peace through the ideals of Sarvodaya. He began his session by inviting the response of the participants to the question. What is the meaning of peace according to you? The participants equated it with stability, peaceful state of mind, satisfaction/fulfillment of basic needs, dignified living, absence of violence in all forms, harmonious and peaceful solution of conflicts, presence of conditions of negative and positive peace, presence of positive values, and so on. In this discussion, the main points that emerged were security for the sustainability of life, positivity, accomplishment, a state of joy within, a situation in which we find solutions for our problems, when the people or friends are happy because of our actions, fulfillment of expectations, mutuality and absence of stress etc.

#### **Revisiting Development: A Gandhian Perspective**

Dr. Siby K. Joseph, Director of Sri Jamnalal Bajaj Memorial Library Research Centre of Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan in his presentation stated that the term development has been a major concern for economists starting with Adam Smith to the pioneers of modern economics. The speaker referred the major initiatives like the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment (Stockholm Conference 1972) and the launch of the United Nations Environment Programme, the establishment of the World Commission on Environment and Development 1983.

#### Sevagram Ashram Darshan

In the evening the students were taken on a guided tour to the premises of the Ashram. A brief history and significance of each hut were explained to them. It provided us an opportunity to have a close look at the premises of the ashram and the Talim premises. Dr. Siby K. Joseph and Dr. John Chelladurai guided the students during the visits and also shared anecdotes during their stay in the Ashram as students.

#### Philosophy of Constructive Programme an

In the last session of the fourth day, the participants had the opportunity to participate in the 10<sup>th</sup> Webinar of Time Demands Gandhi organized by Sevagram Ashram Pratishthan in association with Gandhian Collective India and Ahmedabad. The webinar was broadcast among the participants of the Short term Course on Gandhian Thought for University Students. Prof. Ram Prakash Dwivedi, Former Director, Gandhi Adhyanpith and former Dean, Faculty of Social Work, Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapith, Varanasi, delivered the keynote address. He discussed in detail the significance of the 18 fold constructive programmes of Gandhi for the reconstruction of present different fields. It provided the basis of transformation of society on Sarvodaya lines which Gandhi placed before humanity. Shri Bibhuti Kumar Mishra, National President, Akhil Bharat presided over the webinar and shared his experience in the field of the constructive programmes. Prof. Prem Anand Mishra, Dean, Faculty of Gandhian Studies, Gujarat Vidyapith, Ahmedabad made the concluding observations. Short Term Course on Gandhian Thought for University Students and other participants online raised a number of questions related to the theme. More than a hundred people participated in the Webinar.

#### Day 5 (27.12.2021)

#### Gandhi Comes Alive in Wardha/ Sevagram

The fifth day of the camp began with a digital presentation on Gandhi by Prof. Ciby Joseph. The purpose of this presentation was to introduce Gandhi's life in Wardha / Sevagram after disbanding his

ashram at Sabarmati. Through a collection of rare pictures of Gandhi in Wardha/Sevagram from 1934 to 1946, the story of Gandhi's life and activities was explained through the digital presentation. All major landmarks in Gandhi's life in Wardha/ Sevagram were covered in this presentation.

#### Mahatma Gandhi and Public Health

In the ensuing session Dr. B. S. Garg (MD, Ph. D. FAMS) Secretary, Kasturba Health Society, and Director, Dr. Sushila Nayar School of Public Health, Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram addressed the participants of the camp on Mahatma Gandhi and Public Health with special focus on Leprosy. The key components of Gandhi's approach to public health were focused on diet and nutrition, water sanitation and hygiene, nature and environment, self service and self control. The speaker explained how Gandhi conquered leprosy and initiated the service of leprosy patients including the service of Prachure Shashtri, a Sanskrit scholar at Sevagram.

#### **Valedictory Session**

#### Prof. Rajendra Khimani- Presidential Address

The Valedictory Session was held on the evening of the fifth day of the winter camp on Gandhian thought and action. Prof. Rajendra Khimani, Vice-Chancellor of Gujarat Vidyapith, Ahmedabad presided over the function, and Ms. Radhaben Bhatt, Former Chairperson, Gandhi Peace Foundation, New Delhi.

#### Radhaben Bhatt -Valedictory Address

Ms. Radhaben Bhatt, Former Chairperson, Gandhi Peace Foundation, New Delhi, and Sarva Seva Sangh delivered the valedictory address. The speaker narrated many anecdotes from Gandhi's life. The speaker shared her experience in Europe while undergoing a 6 months course in Denmark.

#### **Summing Up and Distribution of Certificates**

Prof. Prem Anand Mishra, participated in the valedictory session online. He expressed regret that he could not join the programme offline. He summed up the presentations made by Prof. Rajendra Khimani and Ms. Radhaben Bhatt for the benefit of the campers in English. He expressed his all best wishes for the campers and expressed his satisfaction that he could sense the spirit and enthusiasm of participants through the online webinar which he addressed and the valedictory function. Prof. Siby K. Joseph on behalf of organizers expressed a deep sense of gratitude to dignitaries and participants and others for the successful conduct of the winter camp. In the last part of the session, certificates of participation were distributed to the participants.

#### Some Unique features of the Camp

The following were some of the unique features of the camp.

#### **Praver**

Each day of the camp began with Morning Prayer at 6 am at the Seminar Hall of the Yatri Niwas and evening prayer at the open prayer ground of the Ashram at 6 pm. In addition, the students were given an optional choice of attending the ashram prayer at 4.45 am. Some of the students attended the Morning Prayer at 4.45 am.

#### Yoga

Soon after the prayer, a yoga session for half an hour was organized in the hall. All the campers and resource persons with a lot of enthusiasm participated in the Yoga and it was a refreshing experience for all. Shri Abhishek Pathak, Yoga Practitioner, Siddharth Nagar, Uttar Pradesh guided the students in Yoga sessions.

KVKs are grass root level organizations meant for application of technology through assessment, refinement and demonstration of proven technologies under different 'micro farming' situations in a district.

Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Gandhigram a technology transfer centre for Agriculture and allied areas like Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Home Science and forest production was started functioning from 7th July 1989. This scheme sanctioned by ICAR accepting the proposal submitted by the School of Agriculture and Animal Sciences of Gandhigram Rural Institute – Deemed University in the year 1987. The financial support is given by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi. Our Kendra caters the needs of the farming community, Self Help Groups, Rural Youths, farmers produce organization and extension personnel of Dindigul District, through various programmes like trainings, On Farm Testings, Front Line Demonstrations and Advisory services. This kendra has established various demonstration units with emphasis to exhibit the resent technologies in Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, and Home Science enterprises so that, year round income can be generated by the farming community.

#### Introduction

The primary responsibility of UBA cell in HEIs will be to develop linkages with selective rural clusters, involve in the planning process, and promote the requisite interventions to improvise and expedite the developmental efforts in those clusters towards indigenous and sustainable rural development. In this context, the Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), as Regional Coordinating Institute, UBA, actively participated and organized several UBA programmes. #### Virtual Internship Programme on Sustainable Development Goals and Community Engagement

India has given its strong commitment to the achievement of Global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030. NITI. Aayog sets the high-level framework and monitors progress at the national level. The National Education Policy 2020 stresses the importance of alignment of the Education System with the Global SDGs. The University Grants Commission has published National Curriculum Framework and Guidelines on Fostering Social Responsibility & Community Engagement in Higher Educational Institutions in India, providing a framework for student involvement in community engagement.

In this background, and as a part of the regular programme, GRI-RCI organized a Virtual Internship Programme on 'SDGs and Community Engagement' from 2.8.2021 to 25.8.2021. Three thousand nine hundred fourteen participants (faculty members, research scholars, and students) from the 90 UBA PIs in India participated in this programme. This Virtual Internship Programme was a 100-hour programme spread over 21 days. The programme consisted of (1) a series of lectures on various aspects of SDGs, UBA, and Community Engagement - to provide a knowledge base for the Interns on rural development issues for the first two weeks, and (2) Mini Project Work by Interns during the third week. The lectures have been made available on YouTube, Experts from GRI, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, National Institute of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad, National Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research, Chandigarh, NCI, UBA, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi served as resource persons. The resource materials of NITI Aayog, Government of India, UNDP, and Publications of University Grants Commission on SDGs and Community outreach were extensively used. Prof.V.K.Vijay, National Coordinator, UBA, inaugurated the Programme at 10 am on 2.8.2021 in the presence of Dr.S.Madheswaran, Vice-Chancellor, and Dr. V.P.R.Sivakumar, Registrar, GRI. Dr.G.Narendra Kumar I.A.S., Director General, National Institute of Rural Development & Panchayati Rai, Hyderabad, delivered the Valedictory Address at 10 am on 26.8.2021. This programme was organized in collaboration with the NCI, UBA, IIT, Delhi. Through this programme, GRI - RCI trained 3914 students/ research scholars/staff across the country on SDGs, UBA, and community engagement.

This Internship highlighted the importance of SDGs, community engagement, and societal wellbeing and introduced theory and methods related to community extension. The Internship also explored approaches to research and professional practice designed to stimulate social development through community engagement. After completing this Internship, the participants were able to (1) learn to value the local knowledge and wisdom of the community, (2) foster a sense of social responsibility and empathy for the community as a whole, (3) gain an understanding of rural life, culture, and social realities. (4) appreciate significant contributions of local communities to Indian society and economy, (5) learn to value the local knowledge and wisdom of the community, (6) exposed themselves towards adoption of technologies with a human-face; inter-mediate technology that does not replace man, to reduce the drudgery involved, rather than advanced technologies that replace man. (7) understand the connecting link between SDGs and schemes and programmes of the Government, and (8) identified opportunities for grounding the development schemes to foster the community's livelihood. For organizing this programme, a committee with the following members has been constituted with the approval of the administration of GRI by giving representation to the nature of the PIs in this region. #### Virtual Orientation Workshop on Farm Extension services in UBA Villages

A District Specific Virtual Workshop on Farm Extension services in UBA villages for the UBA Coordinators of Ramanathapuram District was organized on 31.8.2021. The same programme for the UBA Coordinators of Theni District was organized on 3.9.2021. Farm experts from NGOs were invited to share their knowledge and experiences in farm extension. A participatory approach was adopted in conducting this workshop. All the UBA Coordinators in these Districts were invited to share their experiences regarding the need for farm extension in their adopted villages and the support of the farmers. The Coordinators were also exposed to the schemes and programmes of the Government for farm and non - farm sector development in these Districts.

#### **Self-Employment Generation for Youth and Women**

Investing in entrepreneurship can create an entrepreneurial mindset, which eventually translates into developing an entrepreneurial orientation among youth and women. Practical entrepreneurship training is a prerequisite to empowering rural youth and women with the knowledge and ability to 'fish rather than just giving them a fish. Also, the broader objective is to increase the number of individuals starting self employment ventures based on local systems of flora and fauna and developing an entrepreneurial culture to reduce poverty (Sustainable Development Goal - 1) and to play a key part in reducing inequalities within and among societies (Sustainable Development Goal -10). In this direction, as well as as a part of the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India's National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM), and as an effort to provide self-employment opportunities during this pandemic situation. the beekeeping training programme was organized for the members of Bathrakaliamman Women SHGs in Sivathiayapuram, Thoothukudi District on 20.9.2021. Beehive boxes were installed in the places of the members. The first collection of honey started at the end of October 2021. Further to providing selfemployment to rural youth, a Joint Liability Group was formed among ten rural youth, and they were given technical training on mushroom cultivation. Mushroom farms have been established in the places of the members in the UBA villages. This programme was being organized by UBA unit of Kamarai College (AISHE Code: C- 41209), Thoothukudi. Also, an effort had been made to enroll these groups as members of Primary Agricultural Cooperative Credit Society Ltd., Sivathiayapuram, to avail of all banking facilities.

#### **Evening Tuition for Village School Children**

Two Solar Street Lights were installed in the UBA village - Kalangari, by St. Mary's College (Autonomous), Thoothukudi (AISHE Code: C-41151). These lights were installed under Perennial Fund Assistance, which was awarded to this college. These lights are useful for conducting evening tuition classes every day by the UBA volunteers and the faculty members of this college for the benefit of Primary School Childrenat Kalangari and West Tsunami Colony, Thoothukudi District. The classes have been conducted daily by UBA student volunteers for the rural kids in the evening for about 2 hours. Due to COVID, these kids have had no classes for the one and half years. As the parents were unable to teach and guide the kids to learn subjects efficiently, this initiative had motivated the rural children to continue their studies. The UBA student volunteers handled classes for these kids and encouraged themto understand the subjects thoroughly. Special attention is given to learning basic Hindi, English, and Mathematics.

#### **School Health Programme**

COVID-19 and its impact on students' mental and physical health was widely recognized worldwide. It has shown us how the rules we adopt in educational institutions quickly lose relevance as they have changed almost overnight and brought a new focus on good health and wellbeing. This pandemic should be a wake-up call for UBA. In this direction and as part of the Ministry of Ayush, the Government of India - Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav - Ayush Awareness Programme (Online and Off-line) has been organized across the State of Tamil Nadu with the help of Ayush Doctors. The objective of this programme was to facilitate the school students to be physically and mentally fit during this pandemic period. During the programme, the Ayush Doctors explained to the students about health and hygiene, preventive measures such as social distancing, hand washing, use of mask and sanitizers, and others. The question and answer time facilitated the students to get information about programmes available for higher studies in the Ayush system. This programme covered 100 schools across Tamil Nadu. Dr.Priyanka Kaushal Co-PI, National Coordinating Institute, UBA, IIT, Delhi, served as Chief Guest for 50th School Programme held online in Government Middle School, Thangalachery, Madurai District, and inaugurated the programme at 10.30 am on 6.9.2021. For 75th School Programme Prof. Vivek Kumar, Co-PI, National Coordinating Institute, UBA, IIT, Delhi, served as Chief Guest and inaugurated the programme at 10.30 am on 15.9.2021. This programme was conducted online at Bharat Ratna Kamarajar Matric Higher Secondary School, Thoothukudi.

The 100<sup>th</sup> School Health Programme was conducted online on 29.9.2021. Arka - The Green School, Andoor, Kanyakumari District. Dr.V.P.R.Sivakumar, Registrar, The Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), Gandhigram, Dindigul, presided over the function. One eighty-one participants from PIs and Regional Coordinators of South India (Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana) participated in this workshop. Initially Prof. K. Ravichandran, Regional Coordinator, GRI - RCI welcomed the participants and explained the workshop's purpose. He said that the workshop would orient the newly enrolled Coordinators on how to carry out the household and village survey, submit project proposals to SEG, and various strategies that could be adopted in community engagement. Dr.T.T.Ranganathan Vice Chancellor i/c, of The Gandhigram Rural Institute (Deemed to be University), Gandhigram delivered the presidential address. He briefly explained the vision and mission of UBA. He appreciated the efforts taken by RCI-UBA such as Arogya Series – Awareness programme on Covid 19, the School health programme, Virtual Internship Programme, and livelihood generation programmes. The National Coordinator, UBA, Prof. Virendra Kumar Vijay, inaugurated the workshop and explained the structure and functioning of Pls, Regional Coordinating Institutes, and Subject Expert Groups. Ramesh, NIRD&PR, Hyderabad, delivered a lecture on 'Proposal development and programme convergence possibilities'. He explained about the proposal writing for UBA Projects, process of data collection, Planning for a Model Village and functioning of Gram Panchayats. Dr. Priyanka Kowshal, National Coordinating Institute, IIT, Delhi, handled the second session on "UBA Framework of Action Plan for Pls, funding, and convergence". She explained the strategies in framing Action Plans, funding, and convergence possibilities. The third session was handled by Prof. K. Ravichandran Regional Coordinator of GRI - RCI, about "the Role of HEIs in SDGs and Community Outreach". The session was about the Sustainable Development Goals and how they could be achieved in the villages through UBA programmes Dr. S. D. Sivakumar, Regional Coordinator, TNAU. delivered a lecture on "Innovation, Incubation, and Start-up through UBA". He explained the challenges and opportunities in agriculture and the means and ways of bringing economic stability through incubation center. At 3.30 pm a question and answer session was held. Mr. Rahul Choudhary and Ms.Bharthi Jasrotia, from NCI cleared the doubts of Coordinators of PIs regarding villagesurvey, submission of Project Proposals to SEG and the alike. In the Valedictory Session, Dr.S. Kavitha Maithily, Coordinator, UBA - GRI presented the report of the programme. Dr.V.P.R.Sivakumar, Registrar, GRI delivered the Valedictory address and congratulated all the newly enrolled institutions. Prof. K.Ravichandran, the organizer of the virtual workshop, proposed a vote of thanks.

#### **Village Internship Programme for UBA Volunteers**

As a part of Azadi-Ka Amrit Mahotsav, a Village Internship Programme (offline) was organized from December 2021 to February 2022. The fundamental objective of this programme was to enable the medical students to comprehend and relate classroom learning to field realities through identifying health issues and problems in UBA villages and providing affordable medical care services to the people. This Programme was implemented in eleven districts of Southern Tamil Nadu. This Programme consisted of four faces. (1) A batch of UBA PIs and UBA villages in Southern Tamil Nadu were selected for placing students as Interns (2) Medical students were placed as Interns in these UBA villages (3) Students undertook a survey to assess the health status of the people and health care services available to the UBA villages. (4) Sensitize rural households, the school students, women SHGs, and other user groups in the UBA villages on the importance of good health and wellbeing and undertake appropriate medical intervention through (a) School Health Awareness Programme, (b) Telemedicine, and (c) organized other

need-based programmes. This programme was virtually inaugurated at 9.30 am on 06.12.2021. Dr.T.T.Ranganathan, Vice Chancellor i/c. GRI, Gandhigram delivered a welcome address, Prof.V.K.Viiav. National Coordinator, UBA, gave the presidential address. Dr.Pinakin N.Trivedi President, Board of Ethics and Registration for Homeopathy. National Commission for Homeopathy. Ministry of AYUSH. Government of India delivered a special address. Dr.G.Narendra Kumar I.A.S., Director General, NIRDPR delivered the inaugural address and inaugurated the programme. Saradakrishna Homeopathic Medical College, Kulasekharam, St.Marry's College, Thoothukudi, Kamaraj College, Thoothukudi, SFR College, Siyakasi, Vyasa Arts and Science Women's College, Thenkasi, College of Agricultural Technology, Theni, Latha Mathavan Engineering College, Madurai, and Alagappa Chettiar Government College of Engineering &Technology, Karaikudi participated in this programme. This Online Interaction Programme was organized at 10.30 am on 03.02.2022. The primary objective of this Online Interaction Programme was to enhance the capacity of the knowledge institutions to plan, execute and monitor the rural development projects by engaging the community in their UBA villages. Dr.Vivek Kumar, Professor, UBA, and Dr.T.T.Ranganathan, Vice-Chancellor (In-Charge), GRI, served as Resource Persons. This online interaction meeting provided a platform to orient the PIs about the Identification of Projects for Proposal Development and Gram Panchayat Development under UBA. The works carried out by Pls in the southern part of Tamil Nadu was highlighted to NCI and the challenges they faced in bringing sustainable solutions was also brought to limelight. The need for mapping of activities on par with other development indicators was expressed to NCI. After productive discussions, the meeting came to end at 12.30 pm. UBA, IIT, Delhi coordinated the technical support for this programme.
